26. Parent- Teachers Association

The college provides round the clock health services to the members of the college community. Though a permanent doctor is not recruited, doctors are invited from the locality as and when required. The college has also one club namely MNCBM Health Awareness Club. Seminars, meetings and camps are arranged to discuss various health related issues. In this session the health awareness and free health check up camp had organized at Gopalthan Balabhavan High School Campus Lourdol on 1st Sep. 2010. Doctors under the initiative of the SDMO Nalbari were arranged.

28. Admission Procedure

- The admission procedure of the college tries to live up to the vision of the founder quality education with social inclusiveness.
- Major students are admitted on the basis of their performance in entrance tests conducted by various departments.
- Notice is putout regarding dates of such tests. To help students a wider choice of Major entrance tests are slotted in a way that a student can appear in as many tests as she chooses.
- Results of these tests are announced before the date of admission. At the time of admission first year student has to pick up two subjects- one on computer under Compulsory Computer Literacy Programme (a specific recommendation NAAC Peer Team) run by C-Dac, a concern of Govt. of India and two a Vocational Certificate Course run by the college. The latter is aimed at enhancing the employability quotient of the learners.
- These courses are delivered at hugely subsidized rate to mitigate the burden of the socio-economically weaker learners.

30. Activities of Guidance and Counselling Unit:

- The cell is empowered to prompt any incident that would have an adverse impact on the academic environment of the college.

32. Activities of Personal Counselling Cell:

The Personal Counselling cell of the college under the proper guidance of Dr. Dipti Choudhury, Associate Professor, Dept. of Education helps students in need of psychological help. The cell also helps students to cope up with academic stress and to help in avoiding intra and interpersonal tension and conflict.
